MIDWEST FOOD BANK MOBILIZES RELIEF HURRICANE BERYL VICTIMS IN TEXAS

LOCATION, ST – Midwest Food Bank (MFB) has launched a significant relief effort to support those affected by Hurricane Beryl, which recently caused widespread devastation in Texas. Four truckloads of essential supplies, including 1,040 food boxes and 500 hygiene kits per load, are being dispatched to Houston, Texas, to aid recovery efforts. The first truck departed on Monday, followed by another on Tuesday, with the remaining two scheduled to leave later this week. Additionally, two semi-loads of water have been shipped from MFB Georgia.

Hurricane Beryl, the earliest Category 5 hurricane on record for the Atlantic season, made landfall in Texas on July 8, 2024, resulting in extensive damage and leaving over a million residents without power. The Texas Division of Emergency Management and various relief organizations have been working tirelessly to address the needs of the affected communities.

MFB is collaborating closely with The Salvation Army to ensure these critical supplies reach those in dire need. This partnership exemplifies the strength of community and organizational cooperation in times of crisis.

"Our mission is to provide not only physical sustenance but hope and support to those whose lives have been upended by this disaster," said Lisa Martin, Executive Director of MFB Morton, IL. "We are deeply grateful for our partnership with The Salvation Army, which enables us to extend our reach and impact."
