**MIDWEST FOOD BANK CONTINUES TO HELP TO HURRICANE IDA VICTIMS**

Midwest Food Bank (MFB) has sent ten loads of Disaster Relief to areas hard-hit by Hurricane Ida. Another eight loads will leave this week, and loads are already planned for next week. A majority of loads are family food boxes, but loads of water and cleaning supplies have been sent, as well.

Semi loads of relief have been sent to Bourg, New Orleans, and Schriever, LA, and Beaumont, TX. MFB is also assisting Ida victims in the northeast, with loads sent to West Nyack, NY, and Philadelphia, PA.

Relief for the August 14 earthquake and Hurricane Ida is also being sent to Haiti. Midwest Food Bank has scheduled two sea containers of food to be sent in the next two weeks. They are also working with Agape Flights located in Venice, Florida, to have relief flown to the country.

Midwest Food Bank is a First Responder for The Salvation Army in providing Disaster Relief. Upon receiving a call, MFB can have Disaster Relief on the road within 24 hours. The Salvation Army receives and distributes the relief items in partnership with MFB.

Family food boxes have enough shelf-stable food to feed a family of four for four to five days. They are assembled, filled, and driven to disaster locations by MFB volunteers

"This will be a long-term effort; the need is great," says Mike Hoffman, Logistics Director of Midwest Food Bank. "MFB is sharing the love of Christ by continuing to provide relief in the coming weeks."
